Introduction

1. System Overview

Drain systems rely on **gravity**, not pressure. - Pipes are sloped for flow - Waste moves downward - Vents supply air

Because drains are not pressurized, most problems progress gradually.

Typical drain issues include: - Hair and soap buildup - Grease accumulation - Minor odors

Abnormal issues include: - Gurgling sounds - Multiple slow drains - Sewer odors

3. What Homeowners Can Safely Do

Homeowners can safely: - Observe affected fixtures - Inspect visible traps - Identify repeat clog patterns

Avoid chemical drain cleaners.

4. When to Stop and Call a Professional

Call a plumber if: - Multiple drains back up - Sewage enters fixtures - Clogs return repeatedly

5. Homeowner Win: Cleaning and Inspecting a Sink P-Trap

- Bucket or pan
- Adjustable pliers
- Rag

Step-by-Step Overview

1. Place bucket under trap.
2. Loosen slip nuts.
3. Remove and clean trap.
4. Inspect washers.
5. Reinstall and test.

- Free-flowing drain
- No leaks
- No odors
